Lead from where you stand:,

Ethics and effecting change

Course Description:

Understanding our values and where we stand on ethical issues in healthcare is not something that we always take time to assess and discuss. Answering the question, "Where do you stand?" can often be difficult, especially when faced with challenging cases in the heat of the moment. Where we stand can be literal and geographical, in that we may work in the ICU, in home hospice, in the emergency room or the outpatient clinic. Where we stand also represents our moral compasses, true values, and what we choose to defend ethically, politically, socially and nationally. This year's conference theme calls us to choose the right over the expedient, involvement over detachment, to care enough to act to effect change from wherever it is that we stand.

Our Keynote speaker, Pamela Grace, Ph.D., RN, FAAN, will talk with us about the essential characteristics of effective healthcare professionals. She will challenge us to look at our values and moral obligations to our patients. She will show us how our actions have a ripple effect and profound impact not only on our patients, but also on our colleagues, on health care and on society at large. In the plenary session, a team of researchers will describe how a nurse researcher-clinician team conducted and used evidence from critical incident and ethnographic research studies to construct two nursing ethics models. Breakouts will include diverse topics with ethical implications such as: caring for the transgendered patient, use of social media in healthcare, advance care planning, the role of nursing leadership to promote an ethical environment, the pediatric transplant patient, and helping nurses stay engaged. These topics will continue to motivate us and help us explore our values, our prejudices, and how we can lead by example.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Discuss the essential characteristics of effective healthcare professionals to achieve ethical outcomes.
- 2. Identify characteristics nurses need in order to influence change and how to appropriately respond to barriers.
- 3. Describe early nursing interventions to prevent or mitigate ethical conflict and moral distress.
- 4. Discuss one way you can demonstrate leadership to create an ethical environment.


